### **CALL FOR CIVIL EXPERT NOMINATIONS**

### Note by the Head, Enablement and Resilience Section

- 1. Nations are invited to nominate candidates for the vacant Civil Expert positions within the following Planning Groups (PG):
  - AC/23 Civil Protection Group (CPG)
  - AC/25 Food and Agriculture Planning Group (FAPG)
  - AC/121 Civil Communications Planning Group (CCPG)
  - AC/143 Energy Planning Group (EPG)
  - AC/320 Joint Health Group (JHG)
  - AC/329 Transport Group (TG): Civil Aviation (TG CA); Ocean Shipping (TG OS); Inland Surface Transport (TG IST).
- 2. The roles and responsibilities of the Civil Experts are detailed in the Annex 6 of the Civil Emergency Planning Crisis Management Arrangements (CEP CMAs)<sup>1</sup>. Consistent with the CEP CMAs, the following apply to the selection/nomination of Civil Experts by nations:
- 2.1. Civil Experts are nationals of Allied or Partner countries made available to NATO for a limited period (3-years) to provide advice and assistance on the use of civil resources; including on other technical matters falling within the areas of expertise of the PG.

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- 2.2. Civil Experts can be representatives of government, administration, industry, business, and academia. Once an Expert's occupational activities cease, nations should inform the International Staff immediately in order for the Civil Experts to be removed from the RC pool of Civil Experts.
- 2.3. Civil Experts' advice would typically consist of oral or written assessments and recommendations, from or outside their normal place of work. They must be willing and able to respond on short notice during a crisis when their advice is needed.
- 2.4. Any use of Civil Experts is ultimately contingent upon the availability of the Civil Expert and the decision of the sponsoring nation.
- 2.5. Experts should attend at least one training activity during their 3-year assignment.
- 2.6. Sponsoring nations are required to provide a **NS** security clearance within six months of their Civil Expert's selection.
- 3. The nomination process follows the steps outlined below:
- 3.1. **Nomination:** Nations to nominate qualified candidates by providing the NATO International Staff, <u>electronically and/or in hard copy</u>, the following documents:
- 3.1.1. a cover letter from their national authorities;
- 3.1.2. a signed and stamped Civil Expert nomination form at Annex 9;
- 3.1.3. an up-to-date curriculum vitae (CV).
- 3.2. **Selection:** the individual PG's Expert Selection Teams will examine all received nominations and recommend the best-qualified candidate for each post.
- 3.3. **Approval:** the International Staff will issue a notice with the PG's Expert Selection Teams recommendations for approval under silence by each PG.<sup>2</sup>
- 3.4. Thereafter, the nominating authorities will receive a **letter of confirmation** from the NATO International Staff. This letter will be copied to the selected Experts.
- 4. Interested nations should send their nominations by <u>15 December 2023</u> to Ms. Skaiste Masalaityte at masalaityte.skaiste@hq.nato.int (UNCLASSIFIED).
- 5. Allies are particularly encouraged to contribute Experts for remaining vacancies to improve the geographic diversity of the RC Civil Experts' pool. In support of NATO's implementation of United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 1325 on Women, Peace and Security and related resolutions; and in line with the NATO/EAPC Action Plan in this regard (EAPC(C)D(2014)0019), women are strongly encouraged to apply.
